The 10th annual SIMD-NAMA conference was held last week in Minnesota. Each year, about 50+ genetic and metabolic trainees attend this "metabolic boot-camp", along with an assortment of nurse practitioners and clinicians whose jobs demand a significant awareness about inborn errors of metabolism.

The purpose of NAMA is to provide attendees an opportunity to learn about a wide range of metabolic diseases, both the classic defects and some of the latest disorders and disease groups. Members of the NAMA faculty deliver prepared lectures, lead small-group workshops, and participate as part of a team in debates around controversial topics in the field.
